# 1.0 Introduction (1/3)

### **Tawteen Vision**

In realization of the Qatar National Vision 2030, Qatar Petroleum (QP) is launching Tawteen, a strategic initiative to create local business opportunities in the Energy sector.

The ultimate aim is to create a resilient and competitive energy support services sector for the State of Qatar through establishing long-term sustainable value through localization of manufacturing, services and distribution channels.

Tawteen has three primary objectives as follows:

- I. Establish sustainable and competitive in-country Suppliers to meet the requirements of the Energy sector in Qatar.
- II. Support the growth and diversification of Qatar's economy through services and other value added manufacturing industries using locally produced feed stocks from the Energy sector.
- III. Support the realization of Qatar National Vision 2030 by attracting companies engaged in knowledge and technology based businesses.

### **ICV** Overview

As part of the localization agenda, the Energy sector is implementing an In-Country Value (ICV) framework designed to create commercial benefits that will drive sustainable economic growth and GDP diversification.


The ICV strategic objectives are:

- I. Maximize the sustainable in-country value creation
- II. Upskill local talent
- III. Develop local suppliers
- IV. Promote in-country private investment



# 1.0 Introduction (2/3)

In order to ensure effective execution from ICV strategy to certification, the following ICV framework has been developed:



### **ICV Plan**

The ICV Plan Templates are part of the tools provided by Tawteen. The ICV Plan is a forward looking view, based on The Company's planned spend during the contract execution.

The ICV Plan must be certified by an ICV Certifier at the end of the contract. For contracts over a year long, The Buying Entity may request the ICV Plan to be certified more than once.

The Company is advised to begin by reading this **ICV Plan Template guidelines** before attempting to fill the templates. This set of guidelines will provide information about the templates, how to fill and complete them and how to submit the ICV Plan once complete.



# 1.0 Introduction (3/3)

# **Information Required**

Tawteen requires The Company to report the following quantitative data:

- 1. Spend on:
  - I. Goods and services
  - II. Workforce training
  - III. Supplier development
- 2. Depreciation and amortization of The Company's assets in the country
- 3. Contract information
- 4. Other

### **ICV Formula**

Once The Company provides the information mentioned above, the template calculates its aggregate ICV score. The aggregate ICV is measured as the total value created in the country across the selected components, divided by the value of the contract.

The formula for calculating ICV is presented below:

$$ICV = \frac{A + B + C + D}{Contract \ value \ (R)}$$

- A. Goods and Services
  - B. Workforce Training
- C. Supplier Development
- D. Investment in Fixed Asset



# 2. Completion Guidelines



# 2.1 ICV Plan Templates Overview

The following templates have been developed by Tawteen to be used by The Company as inputs during the contract life-cycle, for contracts where ICV Plan is applied:



The ICV Plan Submission Template provides a forward looking view, based on The Company's planned spend for the duration of the contract.



The ICV Plan Tracker is a supporting template that enables The Company to track its actual spend during contract execution, and to aid in the ICV certification at the end of the contract.

This document contains all the information necessary to fill out the ICV Plan Submission Template and the ICV Plan Tracker.

- ICV Plan Submission Template: The Company should follow the guidelines in this document as it provides all the information about the template, how to fill and complete each section and how to submit the ICV Plan once complete.
- ICV Plan Tracker: The Company should follow the guidelines in this document for filling out the ICV Plan Tracker. In cases where additional guidance is required for the ICV Plan Tracker, it will be provided in the following box illustrated below:



# **ICV Plan Tracker**

This gray box will contain any additional guidance required to complete the ICV Plan Tracker that are not covered by the guidelines for the ICV Plan Submission Template.



# 2.2 General Instructions (1/2)

The following general instructions should be followed when completing the ICV Plan Submission Template and the ICV Plan Tracker:

- 1. All financial amounts should be reported in Qatari Riyal (QAR), actuals.
- 2. Amounts reported should correspond to the Project's Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements. For more information on Special Purpose Audit and cost allocation principles, refer to section 4.2.
- 3. The maximum ICV Score that can be obtained by The Company is 100%.
- 4. Revenues and costs reported in the template should be consistent with the revenues and costs The Company would report utilizing International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) or Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) in Qatar. For example, if The Company does not recognize an item as revenue or an expense in its income statement, then it cannot be claimed in the template.
- 6. All costs associated with delivering the ICV Plan shall be included within The Company's bid price.
- 7. Amounts reported should not be double counted. For example, if workforce training costs are accounted for in section B. Workforce Training, these costs cannot be counted again in any other section within the template.
- 8. All numbers reported in the template need to be supported by appropriate and auditable documentation; documentation required to be provided to the ICV Certifier.
- Assumptions and calculation methodologies utilized in preparing the template should be consistent with those used in other contracts and/ or prior years.
- 10. The Company is encouraged to amend its existing trial balance codes appropriately to capture specific costs required by Tawteen. This will ensure that the certification will be smooth and cost effective.
- 11. Overheads (e.g. head office costs) should be excluded from ICV calculation. For more information on cost allocation, refer to section 4.2.



# 2.2 General Instructions (2/2)

- 12. Numbers and values presented in screenshots are for illustrative purposes only.
- 13. The template has been password protected to maintain the integrity of the formulas. All data input cells necessary to complete the template are unlocked. This password protection feature should not be tampered with; any Excel files submitted without the password protection in place will not be accepted.



### **ICV Plan Tracker**

- 14. All spend captured in the ICV Plan Tracker should reflect actual spend, and not planned spend.
- 15. Year 1 in the ICV Plan Tracker has a start date equal to the contract start date. Subsequent years have the same start day and month as Year 1.
- 16. If The Company purchases the same category of goods or services from a Supplier, and the Supplier has multiple ICV Scores for that year, then The Company shall use the Supplier's latest ICV Score for that year. For example, if Supplier A has an ICV Score of 10% in March, and an ICV Score of 15% in October, then The Company shall use the ICV Score of 15% as illustrated below:



The Company will submit the ICV certificate to the Buying Entity as evidence at the end of the contract.

### **Contract Details**

This section contains key information about the contract, such as the contract name, number, start and completion date. The Company is not required to fill any information in this section. All cells will be autopopulated based on the information The Company provides in other sections of the ICV Plan Tracker.

- 4. Engagement letter date: the date that the engagement letter between The Company and the ICV Certifier was signed.



### 2. Business Description

The Company shall provide a brief description of the goods and services it provides.

### 3. Contact Information

The Company shall provide details of the persons who are the main points of contact for completing the ICV Plan. Please provide their names, email addresses, and phone numbers.

The Company shall list all related parties (wholly or partially owned subsidiaries, affiliates, JVs), and their percentage ownership, commercial registration or license numbers (if available), and description of goods and services they provide.

# 2.3.4 Plan Components > Contract Information (1/2)

This section contains details about the contract, its terms and its value. In addition, it includes the Plan Monitor and Plan Assumptions.

### 3. Plan Monitor

In this section, The Company shall state the expected mid-point and end of contract planned ICV scores.

This section only applies for contracts longer than one year. It will automatically be shaded in dark grey for contracts shorter than a year and therefore, should be ignored.

# **ICV Plan Tracker**

In the ICV Plan Tracker, this section is called 'Plan Targets'. Once The Company is awarded and ICV Plan Submission Template is approved by The Buying Entity, the planned ICV scores will form targets for The Company to achieve at the mid-point and end of contact.

### 4. Contract Value

The Company shall provide the total contract value in Qatari Riyals (QAR), actuals.



# **ICV Plan Tracker**

In the ICV Plan Tracker, after contract completion, The Company shall input latest contract value incorporating all approved contract variations/ change orders.

### 5. Scope Description

The Company shall provide a brief description of the scope of the contract.

### 6. Plan Assumptions

The Company shall list and describe the assumptions which it based their planned ICV score on.



# 2.3.5 Plan Components > ICV Dashboard (1/4)

This section contains the formula and components used to calculate The Company's planned ICV score. It lists the expected contribution of each component for the duration of the contract, and calculates the ICV score as a share of the contract value.




The stacked bar graph is a visual representation of the percent composition of each component towards the actual contribution per year.

# 2.3.6 Plan Components > A1. Goods (1/4)

In this section, The Company shall capture its planned spend on goods related to the contract execution, and for the duration of the contract. This represents purchases from all Suppliers and includes costs related to manufacturing inputs and raw materials procured.

### **Section Completion Checklist**

The Section Completion Checklist can be found at the top of the A1. Goods tab. The checklist will indicate a check mark ( $\checkmark$ ) once The Company populates the respective table, if left blank, the checklist will indicate a cross (X). The Company shall populate all tables within the tab.

The Company can click on the gray boxes to navigate to the respective tables within the tab.

In this table, The Company shall capture 80% of its planned goods spend, or listed its 1,000 top individual Supplier by spend, by listing individual Suppliers with the respective planned spend in descending order. The Company shall provide the following information for each Supplier:

- Supplier name
- 2. Supplier commercial registration number
- 3. Good category: from the drop-down list, select the appropriate category
- 4. Good subcategory: from the drop-down list, select the appropriate subcategory. This list is dependent on the good category selection
- 5. Brief description of the types of goods that The Company will procure in relation to contract execution and duration of the contract
- 6. Total planned spend on goods per category per Supplier related to contract execution and for the duration of the contract, in QAR actuals
- 7. Supplier ICV Score: This should be backed by an ICV certificate issued by one of the ICV Certifiers. Supplier ICV shall be considered as zero (0%) if they do not have a valid ICV certificate.

Once The Company has either reached the top 80% of its planned goods spend, or has listed its top 1,000 individual Suppliers by spend and thereby covered most of its planned goods spend, The Company shall enter its remaining planned goods spend, in QAR, in Table 1.2.



# 2.3.6 Plan Components > A1. Goods (3/4)

This table has a pre-defined list of Supplier types and The Company shall group its remaining planned spend based on the listed types. These types are:

- 1. International Suppliers: for goods imported directly
- 2. Local Manufacturers: for Suppliers who manufacture items locally
- 3. Other Local Suppliers: for all other local Suppliers including agents and traders

### **Additional Guidance**

- If a Supplier offers more than one category of spend, then duplicate the Supplier name in the row below and complete the details of the additional category.
- In order to capture Suppliers' ICV scores, The Company should request these Suppliers to also provide valid ICV certificates.

# 2.3.6 Plan Components > A1. Goods (4/4)

- When requesting the ICV score from Suppliers that are holding companies, The Company should ask for the ICV score of the legal entity acting as its primary Supplier to accurately assess the ICV of its spend on goods.
- In the case of manufacturing companies, the inventory movement should be presented as a separate line item. This should be based on a consumption basis i.e. adjusting the total purchases during the year with the movement in inventories. A default ICV Score of 50% should be used to adjust the inventory movement at the end of the year.
- Shared costs/ recharges by group entities should be treated as spend with Suppliers with their corresponding ICV Score.
- The following table lists some examples of items to be included or excluded:

### **Additional Guidance**

- Cost of manpower should only be captured for:
  - Qatari nationals
  - Residents with a total monthly compensation greater than or equal to QAR 10,000.
- Costs related to interns, trainers (included under section B. Workforce Training, page 36), and Supplier development (included under section C. Supplier Development, page 40) should be excluded from this section.
- This section should include company employees only. Costs related to contractors and sub-contracted employees should be excluded.
- If The Company's employee's total monthly compensation is above QAR 10,000 but the sponsorship of that employee is not under The Company's name then this cost should be treated as spend on services i.e. the sponsoring company's ICV Score multiplied by the spend on that employee.




# 2.3.7 Plan Components > A2. Services (3/7)

 Part-time manpower (i.e. manpower that are working on multiple projects or head office staff doing work related to contract execution) can be included in this section. This is allowed only if their time is charged against the respective project code and supported by appropriate evidence (i.e. timesheets). Refer to section 4.2 for guidance on cost allocation principles.

In this table, The Company shall capture 80% of its planned services spend, or listed its 1,000 top individual Supplier by spend, by listing individual Suppliers with the planned respective spend in descending order. The Company shall provide the following information for each Supplier:

- 1. Supplier name
- 2. Supplier commercial registration number
- 4. Select the type of service to be provided from the drop-down list

# **ICV Plan Tracker**

In this table, The Company shall capture 80% of its actual services spend by listing individual Suppliers in descending order by year.

This Company shall select the respective Year of spend from the drop-down list. This list is dependent on information inputted in the Contract Information tab.

The Company shall group its spend per year by Supplier.



In cases where The Company's Supplier has multiple ICV Scores in that year, The Company shall combine the total spend for that year and use the Supplier's latest ICV Score for that year.

### **Additional Guidance**

- Training provided to residents with a total monthly compensation below QAR 10,000 should not be accounted for in this section.
- To calculate the ICV contribution in cases where training will be conducted for a mixed staff (mix of Qatari nationals, residents with a total monthly compensation below and above QAR 10,000), calculate the proportion of total staff that are Qatari nationals and residents with a total monthly compensation above QAR 10,000 and multiply this by the training cost. 

- I. Technical: any training given to the Supplier's staff to improve their skills in implementing or operating a particular technology or related application, product or service.
- II. Leadership: any training given to the Supplier's management team to improve their managerial skills and effectiveness.
- III. Exchange program: programs involving the exchange of employees between companies for purposes of skills development and experience of working in different environments.
- **4. Activity Description:** The Company shall briefly describe the actions it plans to take to develop its Supplier.
- **5. Supplier Development Spend:** Specify the total amount of planned spend, in QAR, on the development activity for the duration of the contract.

### **Additional Guidance**

- Assets, and the associated depreciation cost, owned by the entity that are held outside Qatar should be excluded.
- As per standard accounting practices, major refurbishments and repairs, if capitalized in The Company's audited financial statements, should be included in this section.
- Work in progress or assets that have not yet entered service should be excluded. These assets can be included once they are in operation and placed in service.
- Assets that are used for purposes that are not directly related to the Project should be excluded. Shared assets should be excluded from the Project balance sheet. Income/expenses resulting from shared assets shall be realized in the Project P&L statement, and accounted for in other sections. Refer to section 4.2 for details on asset allocation principles.

## 3.0 Submission Guidelines (1/3)

The following items will be used as inputs during the contract life-cycle where ICV Plan is applied:



The **ICV Plan Submission Template** provides a forward looking view, based on The Company's planned spend during the contract execution.



The ICV Plan Tracker is a supporting template that enables The Company to track its actual spend during contract execution, and to aid in the ICV certification at the end of the contract.




The **Special Purpose Audit** is an independent opinion issued on the Project specific financial statements, by a chartered accountant firm, to ensure that the numbers reported present a true and fair view of the Project.



The **ICV Certificate** is issued by one of the ICV Certifiers. It contains key information about The Company and the contract's achieved ICV Score.

The figure below indicates when each of the above inputs will be used during the contract life-cycle.





## 3.0 Submission Guidelines (2/3)

### **Tender submission**

- Once the ICV Plan Submission Template is completed, The Company is advised to verify all of the details to ensure they are appropriate and aligned with the RFP requirements. It is also advisable for The Company to engage its finance department in order to verify these figures before submitting the ICV Plan Submission Template to the Buying Entity.
- During tender evaluation, if requested by The Buying Entity, The Company shall provide additional information clarifying, validating or updating the ICV Plan Submission Template.
- The Buying Entity shall convert the information submitted in the ICV Plan into contractual commitments. In the event of failure to adhere to the ICV Plan, The Buying Entity retains the right to appropriate actions in accordance to the terms of the contract.

### **Contract execution**

- During contract execution, The Company will be expected to keep appropriate documentation and auditable records for all information and assumptions reported in the Plan. Information and records contained in the ICV Plan Tracker will be required and verified by the ICV Certifier at the end of the contract.
- Contracts that are more than one year in duration will be reviewed at the middle and end of the contract, at a minimum. Contracts which are one year or less in duration will be reviewed at the end of the contract. The Buying Entity may request to see quantifiable evidence of progress against the ICV Plan.
- The Company is advised to populate the ICV Plan Tracker on an annual basis to help track the actual spend during contract execution. The ICV Plan Tracker is not required for contracts below 1 year.
- During contract execution, The Company is advised to get Special Purpose Audits, on the Project specific financial statements, on an annual basis to ensure the completeness of underlying audit evidence and to support the annual updates to the ICV Plan Tracker. Produced Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements will form the basis of the ICV certification. For additional guidance on the Special Purpose Audit refer to Section 4.2.



## 3.0 Submission Guidelines (3/3)

 The Company may also engage an ICV Certifier to complete interim ICV certifications where both the ICV Plan Tracker and Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements exist.

### **Contract close-out**

- After contract completion, The Company is first required to get a Special Purpose Audit, on the Project specific financial statements, to ensure that numbers reported present a true and fair view of the Project. Produced Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements will form the basis of the ICV certification. For additional guidance on the Special Purpose Audit refer to Section 4.2.
- Upon the issuance of the Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements, The Company will be required to fill out the ICV Plan Tracker and submit it to a ICV Certifier to issue an ICV Plan certificate. The Buying Entity will then evaluate whether the plan has been met against ICV Plan commitments, submitted during contract bidding.
- Depending on the nature of the contract, The Buying Entity may request The Company to certify their ICV Plan more than once.

## 4.2 Allocation Principles and Special Purpose Audit (1/3)

- A Special Purpose Audit shall be performed on the Project specific financial statements subject to the ICV Plan. These financial statements shall be based on International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), which should cover the following:
  - a) Income Statement
  - b) Statement of Financial Position
  - c) Statement of Cashflows
  - d) Notes to the Financial Statements
- 2. ICV Plan certificates may only be issued when based on the Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements. The Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements could be issued at any point during the year, it does not need to be co-terminus with the date of The Company's annual financial statements but will be driven by the Project completion date. The ICV Plan Tracker should be based upon the Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements after that date.
- 3. The ICV Certifier of the ICV Plan must not also be the auditor of The Company, group or the Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements.
- 4. Allocation principles should be clearly disclosed in the Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements (e.g. shared manpower based on time sheets, materials based on consumption rates, depreciation for shared assets based on machine/ equipment, hours, etc.). Alternatively, The Company should have a well developed inter-departmental procedure that clearly articulates allocation principles and methodologies that will be applied for any Project. The auditor will need to check the allocation principles in order to conform to the methodology and ensure that the principles, have been consistently applied for preparing the statements.
- 5. As a generic rule, the allocation for the cost components should reflect the following:
  - a) Goods and Services policies should be put in place by The Company to allocate indirect costs consistently throughout the lifetime of the Project and reflect the usage of the goods/ services.



## 4.2 Allocation Principles and Special Purpose Audit (2/3)

- b) Manpower compensation policies should be put in place by The Company to allocate manpower costs throughout the lifetime of the Project. These may be sourced from other group companies ('recharges') or third-party suppliers ('shared costs'). With recharges and shared costs, contemporaneous timesheets and inter-group transactions should be evidenced. The basis of costs of the manpower sourced from group companies should be stated in The Company policies and consistently applied.
- 6. The following items are key areas of the Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements which need to be conducted in order to support the subsequent ICV Plan certification. All items must be supported by documentation and be consistent with The Company relevant IFRS accounting policy in place.

- 7. It is highly recommended, but not required, that The Company set up specific bank accounts for each of their projects subject to ICV Plan certifications, in order to provide evidence and audit trail for Project costs and cash disbursements.
- 8. The Company is required to have robust IT-based financial accounting systems in place to capture Project specific costs (i.e. ledger management, Accounts payable, accounts receivable Fixed Asset Management, etc.). Furthermore, specific cost centers for the projects should be set up to facilitate Project accounting.
- 9. The Company is encouraged, but not required, to have Audited Special Purpose Financial Statements for the Project on an annual basis and to have the ICV Plan certified on an annual basis as well.
